Methodology

- September 1, 2018 to May 30, 2019 (9 months)
- Primary
 - Data collected & analyzed Survey, Interviews, Photovoice
 - ❖ N ~ 2,000
- Secondary
 - Literature & document reviews
 - Datasets

Key Findings: Death Rates, Life Expectancy

Mortality (age-adjusted) Rate

Berrien: 815.6/100,000

Michigan: 795.1

United States: 728.8

Life Expectancy

Berrien: 77.3 years

Michigan: 78.1 years

United States: 78.6 years

Key Findings: Disparities

Geographic Disparities:

- Benton Heights has a mortality rate three times higher than Shoreham.
- Life expectancy in Benton Harbor is 19 years shorter than in Lincoln Township.

Racial Disparities:

- The black/white death rate disparity is 32.5%. The premature death rate disparity is 66.4%.
- The death rate disparity is highest (doubled) between the ages of 35 & 64 (i.e., peak wage-earning years).

Key Findings: Top Causes of Death

Top Three:

- Heart Disease
- Cancer
- Cerebrovascular Diseases

Rounding Out the Top:

- Accidents
- Diabetes
- Chronic Lower Respiratory
- Alzheimer's

Key Findings: Priority Health Needs

- Mental Health & Obesity
- The community overwhelmingly points to Social Determinants of Health (SDoH) when discussing the factors most influential in shaping their health.
 - Food Environment
 - Physical Environment
 - Recreational Environment
 - Social Cohesion
 - Spiritual & Religious Practices
 - (Healthcare Resources)

What's New? Our Methods

Primary – Qualtrics software

- Added a question to the survey about how people deal with stress.
- Conducted more in-depth analysis of the qualitative data.
- Reached 60%+ more people 1,900+ (vs. 1,200) & a more diverse survey population.

Secondary – Detailed description/analysis of 12 key SDoH & implications for health equity.

- More sophisticated quantitative analyses.
 - Death rate disparities.
 - Hispanic death rates.
 - Census tract level data for life expectancy.
- Data visualizations (i.e., map overlays, pie charts, scatterplots).

What's Surprising?

- Death Gap: 19 years between Benton Harbor & Lincoln Township.
- Priority Health Needs: There is a disconnect between what the community says are priority health needs (i.e., mental health & obesity) & what is indicated in publicly available data (i.e., CDC indicates that the top five causes of death in Berrien were heart disease, cancer, cerebrovascular, diabetes, Alzheimer's & accidents).
 - The distribution of these causes of death across sex & race.
- Key SDoH: There is a disconnect between the SDoH that we thought were important (i.e., transportation, housing, jobs, education) & what emerged from the survey responses (i.e., food, recreational & physical environments; social cohesion, spiritual resources, & healthcare resources).

Next Steps

- Winter 2020 Full document with detailed analyses & findings.
- Spring 2020 Implementation Strategy
 - Investigate critical associations to determine potential levers and collaborators for population health improvement.
