We serve as a focal point for raising awareness and supporting the needs of adults and children who grieve. Lory's Place provides a safe, comforting atmosphere, in which grief healing can take place, following the death of a family member or an important friend.

Lory's Place also offers community outreach programs, providing staff education and support, as well as peer grief support groups in elementary, middle, and high schools.



Caring Circle founded Lory's Place Grief Healing and Education Center in 2004, in memory of Dr. Lory Tonske Schults who died at age 40 in a car accident. Lory loved her family and enjoyed life fully.

Why is Lory's Place here?

Unaddressed grief, no matter the age of the person grieving, has been shown to have a negative impact on physical health and mental well-being. When people feel understood and accepted, the ability to cope with their feelings greatly increases.

Our goal is to provide both adults and children the support they need during their time of bereavement. We provide life-affirming hope and guidance, help to find answers to life's most complex questions, and build confidence for the future.

Who may come?

Lory's Place is committed to reaching out to all grieving adults, children, and their families. Children, ages three to 18 and their parents, guardians, grandparents, other relatives, and close friends are welcome. Young adults may attend independently, and adult groups are also offered.

What do we offer?

Lory's Place provides regularly scheduled support group sessions that allow children and adults to interact with peers who have suffered loss. Music, art, storytelling, nature, writing, and play promote the healing process.

Age-appropriate groups and program services are offered for children in:

- Preschool/Kindergarten
- Elementary
- Middle & High School

We also offer an anticipatory grief program to assist those experiencing the anticipated death of a loved one due to illness or disease. Adults and children learn to work through their grief and begin the healing process by sharing feelings, experiences, and memories with peers in a support group setting.

Not just for kids!

Lory's Place is dedicated to supporting the entire family, including adult specific support for:

- Death of someone significant regardless of the cause
- Miscarriage, still-birth, and infant death within the first year of life
- Overdose loss
- · Suicide loss

Professional bereavement staff, as well as trained volunteers, facilitate the activities of Lory's Place, including crisis response and support services for grief in the workplace.



When I moved my grief started to get a little bit out of control. I knew I needed help, so I came to Lory's Place. It's been helpful to have other people around me that have experienced grief. In a situation where I'm sad, they've told me what to do and they're by my side all the time.
